AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," providing for Dyslexia Screening 5 Pilot Program. 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding an 10 11 article to read: 12 ARTICLE XVII-C 13 DYSLEXIA SCREENING PILOT PROGRAM

Section 1701-C. Short title of article.

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- 1 This article shall be known and may be cited as the Dyslexia
- 2 Screening Pilot Program Law.
- 3 Section 1702-C. Definitions.
- 4 The following words and phrases when used in this article
- 5 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 6 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 7 <u>"Department." The Department of Education of the</u>
- 8 Commonwealth.
- 9 <u>"Dyslexia." A specific learning disorder that is</u>
- 10 neurological in origin and that is characterized by unexpected
- 11 <u>difficulties</u> with accurate or fluent word recognition and by
- 12 poor spelling and decoding abilities not consistent with the
- 13 person's intelligence, motivation and sensory capabilities,
- 14 which difficulties typically result from a deficit in the
- 15 phonological component of language. OTHER DIFFICULTIES MAY

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- 16 INCLUDE PROBLEMS IN READING COMPREHENSION AND REDUCED READING
- 17 EXPERIENCE THAT CAN IMPEDE THE GROWTH OF VOCABULARY AND
- 18 BACKGROUND KNOWLEDGE.
- 19 "Pilot program." The Dyslexia Screening Pilot Program
- 20 established under this article.
- 21 "Secretary." The Secretary of Education of the Commonwealth.
- 22 <u>Section 1703-C. Establishment.</u>
- 23 (a) Pilot program. -- The TO THE EXTENT FUNDING IS AVAILABLE, <--
- 24 THE department shall establish a Dyslexia Screening Pilot
- 25 Program to provide evidence-based early screening and evidence-
- 26 <u>based intervention services for children with risk factors for</u>
- 27 dyslexia, such as low phonemic awareness.
- 28 (b) School districts. -- The department shall select at least
- 29 three school districts to participate in the pilot program. To
- 30 <u>be considered for the pilot program, a school district shall</u>

- 1 submit a proposal to the department that DEMONSTRATES THAT THE <--
- 2 SCHOOL DISTRICT HAS FUNDING AVAILABLE FOR THE PROGRAM AND THAT
- 3 <u>identifies an evidence-based method of screening children for</u>
- 4 low phonemic awareness and other evidence-based risk factors for
- 5 <u>dyslexia</u>, provides for the enrollment of children identified as
- 6 having evidence-based risk factors for dyslexia in a reading
- 7 program staffed by teachers trained in evidence-based
- 8 intervention programs, for example, multisensory structured
- 9 language programs, and includes a methodology for evaluating the
- 10 effects of the reading program on the children's identified risk
- 11 <u>factors</u>.
- 12 <u>(c) Program operation. -- The TO THE EXTENT FUNDING IS</u>
- 13 AVAILABLE, THE pilot program shall operate for three full school

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- 14 years, beginning with the school year that begins at least six
- 15 months after the effective date of this article.
- 16 <u>(d) Evaluation.--The goal of the pilot program shall be to</u>
- 17 evaluate the effectiveness of evidence-based early reading
- 18 <u>assistance programs for children with risk factors for dyslexia</u>
- 19 and to evaluate whether those programs can reduce future special
- 20 <u>education costs.</u>
- 21 <u>Section 1704-C. Departmental responsibilities.</u>
- 22 <u>(a) Funds.--The department shall apply for Federal, private</u>
- 23 and other non-State funds and shall use available State funds
- 24 appropriated by the General Assembly for the pilot program.
- 25 (b) Consultation.--The department shall consult with the
- 26 <u>International Dyslexia Association</u>, or any other nationally
- 27 recognized organization that specializes in and has expertise in
- 28 the scientific basis of dyslexia and its treatments, in
- 29 <u>establishing and operating the pilot program.</u>
- 30 (c) Report.--Not later than December 31 of the third school

- 1 year in which the pilot program is operating, the secretary
- 2 <u>shall submit a report to the General Assembly containing the</u>
- 3 secretary's evaluation of the pilot program and legislative
- 4 <u>recommendations whether to continue, expand or make changes to</u>
- 5 the pilot program.
- 6 (d) Guidelines and procedures. -- The department shall
- 7 <u>establish quidelines and procedures for the pilot program not</u>
- 8 <u>later than three months after the effective date of this</u>
- 9 <u>article.</u>
- 10 Section 1705-C. School district responsibilities.
- 11 (a) Responsibilities. -- Under the pilot program, each
- 12 participating school district, through early childhood reading
- 13 <u>instruction and reading assistance programs</u>, shall screen
- 14 <u>children upon school entry in kindergarten through second grade</u>
- 15 for indications of dyslexia, provide appropriate evidence-based
- 16 <u>reading intervention services for those children suspected of</u>
- 17 having dyslexia and administer assessments, approved by the
- 18 department, to ascertain whether the intervention services
- 19 <u>improve those students' reading and learning.</u>
- 20 (b) Notification. -- When a child is suspected of having
- 21 dyslexia, the participating school district shall notify the
- 22 child's parent or quardian that the child, as part of the pilot
- 23 program, is eliqible to receive reading intervention services to
- 24 measure the effectiveness of early reading assistance programs.
- 25 The participating school district shall require the parent or
- 26 guardian to indicate in writing that the parent or guardian
- 27 voluntarily and knowingly consents to the child's participation
- 28 in the pilot program. Each participating school district shall
- 29 provide to the parents of children suspected of having dyslexia
- 30 <u>information about dyslexia and recommended evidence-based</u>

- 1 <u>treatments.</u>
- 2 (c) Report. -- Each participating school district shall
- 3 <u>annually report to the department data and information about the</u>
- 4 operation of the pilot program in the manner prescribed by the
- 5 <u>department</u>.
- 6 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
