- (f) In response to an anaphylactic reaction in a student, 15 the following apply: 16
- 17 (1) Where a student who has a prescription for an 18 epinephrine auto-injector on file is authorized to self-
- administer, the student's prescribed epinephrine auto-injector 19 20 shall be either:
  - (i) utilized by the student for self-administration in accordance with section 1414.1; or
  - (ii) provided to and utilized by an educated school employe and administered to the student as provided under this section.
  - (2) Where a student who has a prescription for an epinephrine auto-injector on file is authorized to selfadminister, but does not possess or cannot access the
  - epinephrine auto-injector at the time of the emergency, and the
- 29 school entity or nonpublic school maintains a supply of
- epinephrine auto-injectors, an epinephrine auto-injector from 30
- the school entity's or nonpublic school's supply shall be 31 either: 32
  - (i) provided to the student for self-administration; or
- (ii) provided to an educated school employe and administered 34 35 to the student as provided under this section.
- (3) Where a student does not have a prescription for an 36 epinephrine auto-injector on file in a school entity or 37
- nonpublic school that maintains a supply of epinephrine auto-38
- injectors, an epinephrine auto-injector from the school entity's 39

  - (q) Following administration of emergency epinephrine,

- school personnel shall immediately notify the appropriate emergency medical services agency as defined in 35 Pa.C.S. Ch. 81 (relating to emergency medical services system).
- 4 (h) At the request of a parent or legal quardian, a student
  5 shall be exempt from subsections (a), (f) and (i). The principal
  6 of the school in which the student is enrolled shall notify all
  7 parents or legal quardians of their ability to exempt their
- 8 children from subsections (a), (f) and (i) by returning a signed
- 9 opt-out form. The department shall develop a standard opt-out 10 form that shall be used by all school entities and nonpublic
- 11 schools maintaining a supply of epinephrine auto-injectors.
  - (i) The provisions of 42 Pa.C.S. §§ 8332 (relating to emergency response provider and bystander good Samaritan civil immunity) and 8337.1 (relating to civil immunity of school officers or employees relating to emergency care, first aid and rescue) shall apply to a person who administers an epinephrine auto-injector under this section.
- (j) Administration of an epinephrine auto-injector under
  this section shall comply with section 504 of the Rehabilitation
  Act of 1973 (Public Law 93-112, 29 U.S.C. § 794) and 22 Pa. Code
  Ch. 15 (relating to protected handicapped students).
- 22 (k) As used in this section, the following words and phrases
  23 shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection unless
  24 the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 25 "Department" means the Department of Health of the 26 Commonwealth.
- 27 <u>"Educated school employe" means a school employe of a school</u>
  28 <u>district or nonpublic school who completes an education program</u>
