## AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8	Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "Ar act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," establishing the Ready to Succeed Scholarship Program; and conferring powers and imposing duties on the Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance Agency and the Department of Education.

11	Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
12	as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding an

15	READY TO SUCCEED SCHOLARSHIP
16	Section 2201-B. Short title of article.
17	This article shall be known and may be cited as the Ready to
18	Succeed Scholarship Act.
19	Section 2202-B. Definitions.
20	The following words and phrases when used in this article

- 1 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 2 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 3 "Agency." The Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance
- 4 Agency.
- 5 "State grant." A grant or scholarship awarded under the act
- 6 of January 25, 1966 (1965 P.L.1546, No.541), referred to as the
- 7 Higher Education Scholarship Law.
  - 8 <u>Section 2203-B. Establishment.</u>
  - 9 The Ready to Succeed Scholarship Program is established
- 10 within the agency.
- 11 <u>Section 2204-B. Agency.</u>
- 12 <u>(a) General rule.--The agency shall use funds appropriated</u>
- 13 for the purpose of this article from the General Fund and may
- 14 accept donations from all public and private sources, including
- 15 the Federal Government, to provide scholarships to eligible
- 16 students to defray the cost of attending a State grant-approved
- 17 institution of higher education that is domiciled and
- 18 <u>headquartered with its principal location in this Commonwealth.</u>
- 19 (b) Requirements.--The eligibility criteria developed for
- 20 the receipt of a scholarship under subsection (a) shall, at a
- 21 minimum, require all of the following:
- 22 (1) Total annual household income not to exceed
- 23 \$110,000. With each new award year, the agency may annually
- 24 adjust the total annual household income threshold under this
- 25 paragraph to reflect any upward changes in the Consumer Price
- 26 <u>Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) for the Pennsylvania,</u>
- New Jersey, Delaware and Maryland area.
- 28 (2) At least half-time enrollment in an approved course
- 29 <u>of study.</u>
- 30 (3) Demonstration of outstanding academic achievement.

- 1 (4) Compliance with all aspects of the State grant
- 2 program except financial need.
- 3 (c) Combination. -- A student may be eliqible to receive a
- 4 scholarship under subsection (a) if the scholarship award in
- 5 combination with a State grant award for the same academic year
- 6 does not exceed the annually established maximum amount for the
- 7 Ready to Succeed Scholarship Program as established by the
- 8 <u>agency.</u>
- 9 (d) Discretion. -- The agency shall make all scholarship
- 10 awards under subsection (a) in its sole discretion.
- 11 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
