The purpose of this letter is to ask for you to support SB 801. As a school district that has fully embraced and transitioned to a true structured literacy approach, I can certainly speak to the profound impact it has had on our students.

Our students deserve evidenced-based instructional practices in order to maximize their learning potential. What does this look like in Canon-McMillan? A strong focus on learning to read in kindergarten through second grade by focusing on decoding and word recognition skills. This is followed by a shift to reading to learn in third grade that builds strong background knowledge, vocabulary and language on diverse subjects.

Screening is essential in this process because the earlier you catch a reading problem then the better chance of helping that child overcome that challenge. Screening takes place three times a year for <u>all</u> students kindergarten through fourth grade. We also continue the screening for students identified with reading difficulties for students through sixth grade. These screenings are quick and do not require a lot of time or resources. We utilize Acadience but Dibels also is another easy and effective way to accomplish this screening process.

At the conclusion of the 22-23 school year, our second graders were the first cohort to have received three complete years of structured literacy instruction. We saw tremendous growth in oral reading fluency accuracy among this cohort as compared to previous years despite having experienced the disruptions of the pandemic.
